The English major requires a total of 11 courses, including 3 Literary History (1 before 1660), LNG, and 2 English Electives. Within the Literary History and English Electives, at least one must be from each of the following categories, from the lists in PAWS: American/U.S., British/English, and World literature

The schedule above assumes that the student has taken two English literature courses at the community college. If no English courses have been transferred from the community college, an additional semester or summer/winter session courses will be required.

Semesters 3 and 4 can be exchanged, depending on when the students wants to complete her/his junior practicum semester, but we recommend taking EED 400 after or with the junior practicum.

In the junior year, the student will be required to take a content knowledge examination, which will appear on the transcript as EED 450, a zero-credit, pass/fail course; if it is not passed on the first attempt, it will appear the subsequent semester as well. Passing the exam is not a graduation requirement.

The schedule above assumes that the student has taken two English literature courses at the community college. (American/U.S., British/English, and World literature count as Literary History. Short Story and Novel are examples of English Electives. Children's Literature does not count as an English course.) If no English courses have been transferred from the community college, an additional semester or additional summer/winter session courses will be required.

Notes from the Elementary Education department:

- RAL 221 and ELE 201 must be taken together.
- MTT 202 and MST 202 must be taken together.
- The above courses are prerequisites to ELE 301.
- It is recommended that ELE 301 be taken with RAL 321 and SOM 203. In the event that this prevents the student from completing the major courses, flexibility in scheduling these courses is recommended.
