

**Sample English Secondary Education schedule for students beginning fall 2017 or later.**

<b>Fall (Fr)</b> 1. Foreign Language 2. First Seminar* 3. Liberal Learning Requirement (Lab Science, Math, or Philosophy/Religion) 4. <b>Fall (Sr)</b> 1. SED 399 2. EED 390 3. RAL 328 (These 3 courses are your Clinical 1 block.) 5. Elective or EED 380: Teaching Writing*	Clinical 1 (EED 390 + SED 399 + RAL 328) and Clinical 2 (EED 490 + SED 498) <b>must</b> be in consecutive semesters, either Jr spring and Sr. fall, or Sr. fall and Sr. spring.	<b>Spring (Sr.)</b> 1. EED 490: Student Teaching 2. SED 498: Collaborative Capstone Seminar These two courses, your Clinical 2 block, count as a total of <i>three</i> course units. You may take a course during the senior practicum semester rather than in winter or summer, but it is <b>strongly</b> discouraged.

Please note that your literary history and English elective courses must cover American/U.S., British, and World literature from the lists in PAWS, and that since you will be expected to know Young Adult Literature, it is advisable to take LIT 310 Literature for Younger Readers as one of your English electives.

EED 450 Content Exam is a zero-credit, pass/fail course; if it is not passed on the first attempt, the student will be required to retake it in the fall of the senior year. Passing the exam is not a graduation requirement. You will be pre-registered for this course.

With careful planning, you may complete a minor in addition to your major.

**For an English secondary education major with an associate's degree from a New Jersey community college (and thus no Liberal Learning requirement):**

EED 380 (currently numbered EED 400): Teaching Writing	<b>(4) Spring</b> EED 450: Content Exam 1. Major Course (LIT 499 or 497) 2. SED 399 3. EED 390 4. RAL 328 (These 3 courses are your Clinical 1 block.)
<b>(5) Fall</b> 1. EED 490: Student Teaching 2. SED 498: Collaborative Capstone Seminar These two courses, your Clinical 2 block, count as a total of <i>three</i> course units.	Note: Although the department advises against taking LIT 499 with Clinical 1, and advises against taking <u>any</u> additional course with Clinical 2, for many transfer students, one or both of these situations is unavoidable. Under no circumstances may a student take two sections of LIT 499 in the same semester.

The English major requires a total of 11 courses, including 3 Literary History (1 before 1660), LNG 201 or 202, and 2 English Electives. Within the Literary History and English Electives, at least one must be from each of the following categories, from the lists in PAWS: American/U.S., British, and World literature.

The schedule above assumes that the student has taken two English literature courses at the community college. If no English courses have been transferred from the community college, an additional semester or summer/winter session courses will be required.

EED 450 must be taken the spring before student teaching, so if you are able to arrange your schedule so that you graduate after 4 semesters, EED 450 must be taken in the second semester.
