

ELEM or EACH English in a BS/MAT programs entering AFTER FALL 2020

This is a double major in **Urban or Special or Deaf Ed** in which **English is the 2nd major**.

This sample plan assumes no transfer credit, no dual credit classes taken in HS, and no AP class credit.

Liberal Learning – students with an **ELEM or ECEM** major need just one LL course in addition to their double majors, and they must take **American history**. All other Liberal Learning classes are taken inside the **ELEM or EACH** or **ENGA** majors. Students who elect not to take their VPA inside the English major must give up one of their free electives to take a VPA. “Gender” and “Global” can be combined with many English electives, or can be combined with American History, or can be combined with a free elective, or can be part of the FSP. “Race and Ethnicity” is taken inside the **ELEM or EACH** major.

An English elective is any class with a LIT, CWR, or LNG prefix. Classes in other programs can be petitioned to be English electives, but only one English elective can be taken outside of the three English major prefixes. At least one American literature class and at least one British literature class must be selected among the literary history or English elective offerings. At least five English major classes must be taken at the 300 level or higher. **Many English classes can be taken out of order, but no one may take two LIT 499 classes at the same time, and LIT 102 is a pre-requisite for LIT 499.** Students who elect not to take LIT 310 must take **RAL 225 or ECE 102** in place of one of their free electives.

A student who wishes to Study Abroad should consider a summer or winter term class, Global Student Teaching, or sophomore year. By taking LIT 310, a student reduces her School of Ed program to 16-17 courses. Students in 5 year programs should take the VPA suggested by the School of Education

A student always needs at least 11 English major courses, all the requisite ELEM or EACH major courses, and at least 32 course units to graduate. See your advisor.
