Liberal Learning – students with an ENGA major need six courses in addition to the ENGA major

1. World Views and Ways of Knowing (philosophy, religion, etc.) WVK
2. Behavioral, Social and Cultural Perspectives (social sciences) BSCP
3. Social Change from a Historical Perspective (history) SCHP
4. Quantitative Reasoning (math) QR
5. Lab Science (cannot substitute a non-lab science) NS-Lab
6. Any one 6th course chosen from Category 2, 3, 4, or 5 above, or a non-lab science class.

Liberal Learning – students with an ENGA major and a Second Major need five courses in addition to the ENGA major. If their major falls into Category 2, 3, 4, or 5, they need only the other categories. Students can take “Gender,” “Global” and “Race and Ethnicity” inside major, minor or Liberal Learning classes.

An English elective is any class with a LIT, CWR, or LNG prefix. Classes in other programs can be petitioned to be English electives, but only one English elective can be taken outside of the three English major prefixes. At least five English major classes must be taken at the 300 level or higher. At least one American literature class and at least one British literature class must be selected among the literary history or English elective offerings. **Many English classes can be taken out of order, but no one may take two LIT 499 classes at the same time, and LIT 102 is a pre-requisite for LIT 499.**

A student always needs at least 11 English major courses and at least 32 course units to graduate. **Any ENGT student wanting to add the 5<sup>th</sup> year MA in English should consult the Coordinator of the English Graduate Program.**
