Liberal Learning – students with an ENGT major need three courses in addition to the ENGT major if they take LNG 202 as their linguistics. Otherwise, they must take a 4th LL course that is a SCHP (History). Students can take “Gender,” “Global” and “Race and Ethnicity” inside major or Liberal Learning classes.

1. World Views and Ways of Knowing (philosophy, religion, etc.) WVWK
2. Quantitative Reasoning (math) QR
3. Lab Science (cannot substitute a non-lab science) NS-Lab

An English elective is any class with a LIT, CWR, or LNG prefix. Classes in other programs can be petitioned to be English electives, but only one English elective can be taken outside of the three English major prefixes. At least five English major classes must be taken at the 300 level or higher. An ENGT student must select at least one American, one British, and one world literature class from among classes in literary history or among English electives. **Many English classes can be taken out of order, but no one may take two LIT 499 classes at the same time, and LIT 102 is a pre-requisite for LIT 499.**

A student always needs at least 11 English major courses and at least 32 course units to graduate. Any ENGA student wanting to add the 5th year MA in English should consult the Coordinator of the English Graduate Program.
